Did You Know

For ODSP- As of September 1, 2013, you can earn up to \$200 a month without having your income support reduced. If you earn more than \$200 a month, 50 per cent of your net earnings over \$200 are deducted from your income support payment.

For example: if your ODSP payment is \$1,000 and you earn \$200 then your total monthly income will be $\$1000 + \$200 = \$1,200$

If your ODSP payment is \$1,000 and you earn \$300 then your total income will be $\$1000 + 200 + 50 = \$1,250$

Q: Why?

Since coming to Peterborough I have attended several meetings and workshops about reducing poverty but I notice that very few people with limited income are in the audience. Don't these people want to be involved in efforts to improve their financial status?

Just Wondering

A: Dear Just Wondering,

I am guessing that you probably moved to Peterborough relatively recently. Ten years ago there was excitement about these meetings and a strong representation from the people in need. But after a plethora of workshops and conferences and commissions and think tanks and forums during which people put their needs in order of urgency and put little coloured dots on wall charts and waited for changes that never happened, the poor turned their time and attention back to their personal struggle to survive. As one clever woman with degrees and volumes of experience told me, "We have been studied to death. If they really want to help they would make meaningful changes and increase our income."

Recipe for Hunger

Food insecurity is a local issue with 10% of people in Peterborough households being food insecure. This means that:

- Families, individuals and seniors worry about not having enough to eat,
- Families, individuals and seniors compromise the quality of food they eat
- Or they do not have a variety of food choices on hand.
